

Watch Group Form



Please complete the following form and return to the Education Director no more than two weeks prior to your Research Expedition. Using this form, participating students will need to be divided into two Watch Groups (Wind Watch or Water Watch). Over the course of each day, each Watch Group participates in Sailing/Navigation and Science (barring any unforeseen circumstances). For example, while Wind Watch engages in Science, Water Watch engages in Sailing/Navigation, then they switch. These Watch Groups are also used to divide groups of more than 11 into sleeping locations (see more below). Each Watch Group will have assigned adult chaperone(s) that rotates with the group to help provide additional support. Please assign chaperones to Watches below as well.

Please choose groups with care and consider social dynamics in your decisions. We strongly recommend mixed ages and genders within each watch group. Thank you!

Sample Watch Schedule (varies on Day 1 due to departure time)

10am-12pm: WATCHES - WIND: Science || WATER: Sailing/Nav
 12-1pm: Lunch/Exploration
 1-3pm: WIND: Sailing/Navigation || WATER: Science
 3-5pm Docking/Land Excursion
 Sleeping: WIND: On Shore || WATER: On Boat

[Watches will alternate schedule/sleeping location]

Sleeping Arrangements

During the Expedition, students will alternate between camping onshore and sleeping onboard the boat, depending on their assigned Watch and corresponding schedule. Sleeping quarters are arranged according to gender identity within the Watches. On shore, students sleep in group tents according to gender, with adults sharing same gender tents separate from students. On the boat, there are two separate sleeping quarters with bunk style beds that accommodate up to 7 students each, assigned by gender as well.
